Welcome everyone to a fantastic new year at Coatesville School!

At assembly this week we will complete the annual introduction of our new classes and their teachers. And over the following few weeks we will introduce all of our new students individually to the school, with a selected ‘buddy’ to provide plenty of support.

## **School Roll**

The school roll reached 288 on Day 1. This would be the highest number of students ever to start a year at Coatesville School! Having healthy roll numbers allows us to generate greater staffing and additional MOE funding. So it is all very positive!

## Wastewater system upgrade

During the holidays our wastewater system was given a significant upgrade. Our old system needed to be replaced to ensure our facilities can adequately cope with our increasing number of students.

The two areas of the field most affected by the upgrade have been fenced off and are being left to settle, before having more topsoil added and tidied appropriately. The strip of the field near the road will be grassed and become a part of the field, once again, over time.

A huge thank you to Karl Sentch, our BOT Property Officer, who has spent many, many hours ensuring this project was carefully planned and implemented. Karl's knowledge, skill and willingness to take responsibility, and officially project manage the job (for no fee whatsoever), has been of enormous benefit to the school. A potentially large project management cost has been avoided and a high quality outcome has been achieved. Thank you so much Karl - your input has been invaluable.

Our wastewater system efficiency has been significantly enhanced for the benefit of everyone.

This has been a Ministry of Education funded project. The MOE provide limited funds every 5 years to schools, to ensure their property needs are met. In reality, the MOE funds often just cover infrastructure and Health & Safety priority projects (replacement of roofing is our other big project for this 5 year cycle!) with little left to spend elsewhere. This is why when we look to enhance our school (eg. redevelopment of existing learning spaces or addition of spaces - like our planned enhancement of the library/Rm 3-4 area) the funds have to come predominantly from the BOT, our community or from grants.

Or we have to wait until the next 5 year MOE fund becomes available (4 years from now!). But then we still have to ensure all essential MOE priorities are met, after condition assessments of the school, before we can allocate what is left to an 'exciting' project. Hopefully in the next funding round, we may have some funds left over to do so.

## Hats / Sun safety

During Terms 1 and 4 all students must wear a Coatesville School hat when outside during school hours. If students do not have a hat they are required to play in the shade.

New students are given their first hat free. If students require a new hat they are able to purchase one for \$15 from the office. But I advise students and parents to look around before they purchase a new one. The hat may be at home, in a classroom or in the lost property (behind Rm 11 where I found 8 hats this week!)

## Morning Bells

The old-fashioned **school handbell** is rung at 8.55am to signal school is about to begin.

We require all **students to be in class ready for the roll to be called at 9am** when the electronic bell will ring.

If students are not present for roll call they must go to the office to get office staff to record them as being late.

## Playgrounds – after school

The adventure playground (beside the path up to school) and the oak tree playground (in the middle of the school) are available to be used after school by children - as long as an adult is directly supervising them. If they are waiting to be picked up they are not allowed to be playing on the playgrounds.

The **forest playground is out of bounds after school** as we do not want children (and pre-schoolers) crossing the driveway when vehicles are coming and going regularly. Later in the evening or the weekends are perfectly fine!

These rules are designed to ensure the safety of users as we are not able to supervise playgrounds at these times.

## Chinese New Year

Today (the 5<sup>th</sup> of February) is Chinese New Year!

We are so lucky to have our Chinese Community organise some very exciting event for us! They will be sharing some items at Assembly and are making **dumplings for lunch on Friday (orders needed to be in today)**.

Chinese families also wear red clothes to celebrate as in their culture the red colour means wealth, health, luck and happiness! **We would love as many of our Coatesville children as possible, to wear red this Friday** to join in the celebrations!
