Age Category Change - Swimming Sports 2024



The 'Interschool' group of schools (Coatesville, Upper Harbour, Ridgeview, Greenhithe & Albany) have agreed to move to 'Year Level' categorisation of students (i.e Year 3, Year 4...) for the 2024 Swimming Sports events instead of 'age at the day of the event'.



- Improved clarity and simplification for students, whānau and staff regarding student age categorisation for sports events
- Aligning the age categorisation with other events the cluster hold or participate in e.g. Netball, Hockey, Touch, Winter Sports Days, Football Festivals, Rippa Rugby Days which are all year level based

If this change is also confirmed by the wider Northern Bays Primary Schools Cluster, then this categorisation will also be implemented for our 2024 Cross Country and Athletics events.








Year 3-6 Hockey Registrations 2024

SCHOOL TEAM - FLIPPA BALL

Taking expressions of interest in starting a Flippa Ball School Team played at the Millennium Pool on Sunday afternoons. Most of you already have your winter sports organised so depending on the amount of interest received we may need to look at starting in Term 1.

What is flippa Ball? Flippa Ball is most commonly known as 'Mini Water Polo'. The game is a water based sport and is a great way for kids to be active while building confidence when in the water. The game is for Primary aged school children from years 3, 4, 5 and 6. The sport is played in a shallow pool (1.2m – 1.3m deep) and uses a range of ball skills, swimming and team work. Flippa Ball is a great stepping stone into Water Polo with kids learning the basic skills needed to take on the deep water in Intermediate and Club level
