I hope you all enjoyed the Easter break and the chance to enjoy some quality time with the family.

This year Easter has come very close to the school holidays (which start at the end of this week) so suddenly, after a busy term, we only have a few days left.

But looking back, it has been a very successful Term 1. We have made a very strong start to the year, with a stable and motivated staff, and very positive learning attitudes and consistent work effort from our wonderful students.

The review and refinement of our school direction (school charter) prior to the school year starting, and the preparation undertaken for the ERO visit, helped focus the start of our year extremely well.

Our ERO visit gave us the opportunity to share our progress and achievement at BOT, school leadership and teaching staff levels and we were extremely pleased with the outcome of the review.

Thank you all for your support of the school. We are now looking forward to using the upcoming holiday break to recuperate, refocus and reignite learning for the rest of the year. We aim to fulfil the detailed plans and expectations we have across all learning and organisational areas.

One of the plans for Term 2 involves ...

<u>'Teacher Only Day' – Friday June 1</u>

There will be a 'Teacher Only Day' on Friday 1 June involving all teachers from our 'Community of Learners' who will be attending a learning conference at AJHS.

This is the Friday before Queens Birthday weekend.

School will be closed for instruction on that day.

What is our 'Community of Learners'?

Coatesville School is a member of "Whanau ki te Ako – Kahui Ako", a community of learners.

Our 'Community of Learners' is made up of the staff and students of five contributing schools: Albany Primary School, Coatesville School, Greenhithe School, RidgeView School and Upper Harbour Primary School. These are feeder schools to Albany Junior High School, which in turn provides a pathway to Albany Senior High School – both of which are part of the 'Col' also.

The 'Community of Learners' was formed to enhance achievement and provide opportunities for all students. The initiative supports individual schools to work towards 2018-19 achievement targets in writing, mathematics, NCEA and University Entrance. These targets include supporting students achieving below expectation and increasing the number of students achieving above expectation.

This will also involve the adoption of strategies to accelerate Maori, Pacific Island and Chinese learners, and those with additional learning needs.



In response to initial data collection, school leaders identified six drivers which form the 'Theory of Improvement'. The drivers are Collaboration, Learner Agency, Teacher Effectiveness, Cultural and Relational Responsiveness, Community Involvement and Transitions.

We believe that by developing shared understandings and improving the capacity to deliver our six drivers, student achievement will increase. This pedagogical approach will allow us to meet the individual and collective needs of our schools, leverage a wider skill set, promote greater change and provide consistency within and across our schools to benefit students.

After significant development last year, we will begin the implementation phase of the Kāhui Ako intervention in 2018. This will involve:

- Building collective capacity to lead change
- Developing shared understandings of 'Learner Agency'
- Embedding robust, professional inquiry as the foundation of teacher reflection and learning
- Continuing a shared journey with our combined Boards of Trustees
- Developing schools' capacity to work towards Digital Fluency outcomes for 2020
- Engagement with Early Learning and Tertiary providers
- Monitoring and reporting on interim progress indicators

We will keep you informed as more develops from this 'community' as we look to collaborate across schools to enhance what each school is able to achieve for its students.

Our 'CoL' Leaders

This year we have appointed two teachers from our staff to be our 'CoL Within-School leaders'.

Miss Sarah Mussett and Mr Caleb Rosamond are part of a 'CoL-wide' team who meet twice per term to help plan 'CoL' aims/goals and to share their work within their school, including research, observation and data analysis.

They are currently working on supporting 'learner agency,' which is about learners understanding their role within the learning process and fulfilling that role with the most effective support to make the most progress or the highest level of achievement possible.

We look forward to staff and students benefiting from their CoL work this year.
