

It is time for parents/caregivers to sign up and start your **HERO** journey!

<u>Next week</u> you will receive **login information and details of the steps we are taking this term** and for the rest of the year. Thank you for your patience.

There are many potential features contained within the HERO student management system (SMS). This is very exciting for staff and opens up a number of possibilities to take communication between school and home to another level.

Step by Step

To fully understand HERO's features, and to support long term success with the system (especially supporting our staff & their growth), we are taking a managed step by step approach. We will start off making several features available and will then look to utilise additional features whenever possible. We will implement 'new' features in a timely but carefully managed way. Any new initiatives or feature will be clearly communicated and support given for staff and parents/caregivers.

As per the recent school email: Key aims for Term 2

- 1. Minimise the amount of rubbish generated at school
- 2. Keep our school grounds tidy and rubbish free
- 3. Encourage reusing and/or recycling by all students and staff
- 4. Send much less rubbish to the landfill!

How?

From the start of Term 2, what you bring to school you must consume or take back home!

All wrapping, containers and food scraps will have to go back home. (Options for student recycling and composting will be explored during the term but will not be available at the start.)

So classroom rubbish bins will not be available for students to use - unless the teacher directs them to during learning time.

Minimising lost property at school is also an aim for our 'environment' leadership group.

We will remember them - Anzac learning experience

Our Year 6 students are learning about World War 1 and about the ANZACs. Our students had an exciting start back to Term 2. The classroom was transformed into our very own Anzac Cove, Gallipoli Peninsula, Turkey. 'Trenches' were set up in the classroom, barbed wire framed the windows, poppies, letters from home and photos of loved ones were also displayed in the windows. Students were welcomed first thing in the morning by Lieutenant Fitzgerald and Lieutenant Varcoe. We paid tribute to all of the New Zealanders that fought for our country, and completed one minutes silence while the last post played. Students spent the day doing their Anzac learning in the 'trenches' that we set up.

We learnt more from reading soldier's diary entries and watched some videos about the trenches. We imagined that we were soldiers or nurses in the war, and wrote letters home to our families.

Some special packages were delivered to our trenches, which included letters from home and our daily rations of ANZAC biscuits. The students enjoyed their delicious snacks and appreciated the parcels from "home". The students loved some of the 'boot camp drills' we did throughout the day.
