Mid Year Progress Reports



Progress reports will be **shared digitally & exclusively through HERO** on the last day of Term 2. This will begin our use of HERO as an online platform to share your child's progress with learning. There will be more steps over the coming months but sharing progress information is a big, and positive, first step.

Progress reporting will feature:

- **progress graphs indicating current progress**
- **a statement regarding their current year level expectations**

An example (right) shows a Yr 6 child with a 'dot' at the upper end of the 'At' expectation band - close to 'Above' expectation

Progress reporting will feature graphs and statements for:

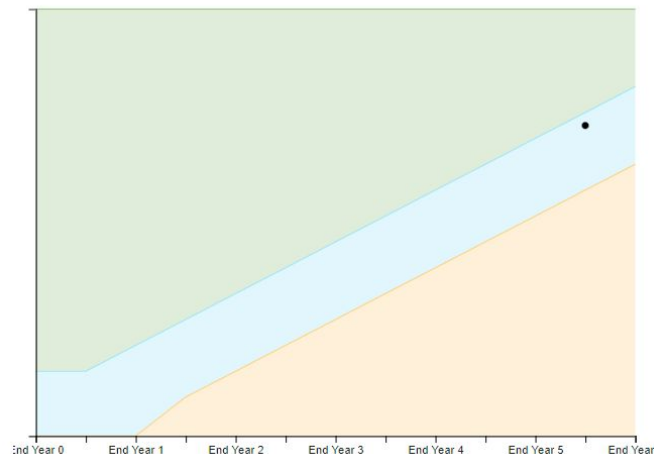
- **Reading, Writing, Mathematics ('Number & Algebra') and Mathematics (Measurement, Geometry and Statistics)** using 'stages' of learning
- **Coatesville Competencies: Responsibility, Reflection and Respect** using 'progress steps'

It will also feature a '**Mid Year Comment**' summarising the progress of your child.

Mid Year Reporting: Conferences

Week 2, Term 3: Over two afternoons/evenings

These conferences are a chance for the student, parents/caregivers and the teacher to meet early next term to discuss progress from Terms 1-2 and look ahead to the second half of the year. Specifically this will include discussion of:

- **Mid Year Progress Report**
- **Next steps for learning** (goals/targets)
- **Expectations for the student** for the rest of the year
- **Student's start to the new term**

The areas covered will be reading, writing, mathematics and Coatesville Competencies.

The conferences are very important as they complement information contained in the Progress Report and allow further clarification and thoughts to be openly shared to support the student. Additional options for sharing student progress via HERO will be added over the coming months to provide information outside of our established reporting times.

But all students will receive an **Achievement Report in Term 4 summarising their achievement** during the year. Conference opportunities will be scheduled too - more details later in the year!

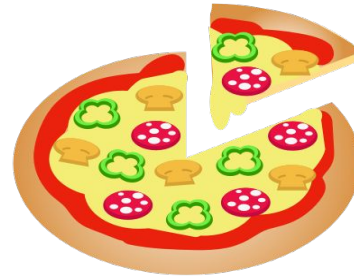
