The 4 key priorities we've identified are:

- **2: Communication of Student Progress and Achievement:** Strengthening communication to ensure clarity and consistency
- **3: Supporting Staff Wellbeing:** Promoting and maintaining a healthy and safe working environment for all staff
- 4: Giving Effect to Te Tiriti o Waitangi: Promoting and providing opportunities for staff, students and whānau to engage in Te Reo and Tikanga Māori

Thank you to all who contributed feedback and ideas last year. It has been hugely valuable and we welcome your on-going dialogue as we fine-tune our strategic plan over the coming weeks.

Teachers: Classroom Release Time

In <u>addition</u> to the regular 'Teacher Release' (outlined on the previous page), **all teachers are allocated 'Classroom Release Time' (CRT) to fulfil their professional obligations** - ie. planning, assessment, resource collection, coaching meetings, professional inquiries

This CRT is part of the collective agreement conditions for all teachers in New Zealand.

In 2023 the allocation per term was 2 days per term (or an hour a week).

This allocation has now risen to **3 days per term for Terms 1-2 in 2024** and will rise again to **4 days per term for the second half of the year**.

In 2025, the allocation will be further increased - to 5 days per term.

It will mean more time out of the classroom for all teachers. But the work that will be achieved during the release time will ultimately be beneficial to students and to parents/caregivers.

We have very capable release teachers working in our school who provide teacher release and do a terrific job of continuing the classroom programme on those days.

School Hats



Every child gets a **free Coatesville School hat when they first start**. New children should've received their hat from the office by now.

All children are expected to wear their school hat when outside during Terms 1 & 4. Children are not permitted to wear other hats.

If you need to buy a new hat please pay online (\$20) to the school account - ASB 12 3059 0307932 00 - then bring your child to the school office for sizing.

We do want children to look after their hats and make sure they are safely placed at the end of every day. It saves them being placed in the lost property and/or parents having to buy a new one!
