# **Attendance: Justified vs Unjustified Absences**

The MOE & ERO are currently very focused on maximising student attendance across the country, due to the concerning amount of learning time that can be lost over time.

So we are doing our best to make attendance expectations clear to our parents/caregivers.

With HERO <u>your child's attendance record is now very visible</u>. This includes all <u>half-days</u> 'present' and all 'justified' and 'unjustified' absences.

Justified absences: Medical reasons, doctor/dentist appointments, funeral or tangi Unjustified absences:

- Explained but unjustified reasons (ie. not school policy or principal approved)
- **Holiday during term time** (Note: Holidays of 5 school days or more, a parent/caregiver must complete an official 'Leave Form' found also on our school website)
- If no reason is given

Please use HERO to report any absences - it is the easiest way to do it! For you and our staff!

# **Student Wellbeing**



Classes are all focused on delivering a structured 'Student Wellbeing' programme this term. The aims of the programme are to empower students to support their own wellbeing and to know what to do when they need support for themselves or others.

The <u>Student Wellbeing page</u> on our school website includes important information on the following:


