Progress & Achievement Reporting

Barely three weeks into Term 3 we ceased onsite learning. Three months later we are finally back!

This has meant a significant restructuring of our usual achievement reporting process for individual students. Distance Learning was implemented to provide continuity of learning for students. It simply does not give teachers the opportunity to make highly accurate judgements for reporting purposes (at a primary level anyway).

Based on the work completed online over the past three months, we do not have enough information of what students can demonstrate independently (without support).

Students have also had differing levels of engagement over the past few months.

What will reporting look like?

Schools will vary in how they approach end of year reporting this year but many schools are adopting a very similar approach to our school.

We will produce a report which will **summarise learning in 2021 and will act as a starting point for learning in 2022**. We will not make ‘overall judgements’ against year level expectations (refer to the Progress Report from Term 2 for the last reference point) but this information will be extremely helpful for starting 2022 with clarity - for next year’s teacher and for the students themselves.

The **‘Learning Summary Report for 2021’** will include:

- A personal ‘General Comment’
- ‘Positive Progress’ in learning - for each of Competencies, Literacy & Mathematics
- ‘Next steps’ for learning - for each of Competencies, Literacy & Mathematics
- A personal ‘Final Comment’

After the issuing of this report parents will be asked to share any comments and questions they have. This will be an important contribution to the targets/goals for each child to be determined very early in 2022.

We want to start 2022 with clarity and urgency. We want momentum from the start of the year, as we all hope for minimal disruption to learning after the past two, very challenging, years.

Coatesville School/Community Pool - 2021-22 Season

The opening of the swimming pool for this season is yet to be confirmed.

Public pools are not to open at Alert Level 3 Step 2.

We will do our best to reopen the pool as soon as is practical but this will be influenced by any Alert Level or 'Traffic light' level restrictions at the time and our ability to ensure the pool and the pool environment is safe for all those who use it. This may provide several challenges.

A risk management analysis will be undertaken by school leadership & the BOT prior to any decisions made regarding reopening. The school community & previous pool keyholders will then receive information.

Confirming student numbers for 2022

Currently we are confirming student numbers for 2022.

We completed a ballot for out-of-zone students for 2022 last month.

Now it is extremely important we have a very accurate picture of the number of students at each year level so we can arrange classes and class numbers with the right balance across the school.

The process for confirming classes for 2022 will begin shortly.

Thank you for your support. Stay safe and well.


