Community Posts - sharing key events



Policy Review: Home Learning: The BOT reviewed a number of school policies last week with Home Learning being one key focus. Taking on board Whanau feedback, and ensuring alignment with our strategic goals, we feel the newly revised policy is achievable for all families and will be presented to you over the coming week.

Classroom Refresh: A much-needed refresh for Rooms 11, 12 and 13 is in store, after detailed plans were recently signed off by the Board.

Home Learning: Policy



After recent review, the BOT have ratified the following Home Learning policy:

Home learning is an extension of the school programme and supports, enhances, and consolidates teaching and learning. It provides a positive link between home and school.

The class teacher:

- outlines expectations, routines and suggested time requirements for home learning to students and parents at the start of each term
- sets home learning that reflects students' changing ages and stages and reinforces teaching and learning
- ensures students understand their home learning tasks and can work independently, where possible

Students

- are responsible for their own home learning
- understand their home learning tasks and work as independently as possible

Parents:

- encourage and support their children
- provide feedback to the child and the teacher

Home Learning: Procedures



The following expectations support the Home Learning policy:

- Home learning directly relates to English/Literacy and Mathematics classroom programmes currently being implemented
- Home learning should be focused at an appropriate level for each student
- Students should be able to learn/practice independently, with only occasional support *
- A maximum of 4 days per week, 15-30 mins per day is to be completed
- Home Learning, as outlined by each team each term, is expected to be completed

Guidance for students who are not yet fully independent will be shared with parents.

Home Learning will support the following learning programmes:

'Reading for pleasure' (self-selected books)

'Literacy Sets' (decodable readers) or 'Guided reading' (provided by teachers)

'Storytelling' (self-selected topics for writing or presenting)

'Spelling/Encoding' (sound/word patterns, words, dictated sentences)

'Maths' - Number knowledge and/or number strategies (Mathletics for Yr 3-6 and other resources)

As a result of the Home Learning review, staff will <u>share more information next week</u> to clarify what Home Learning (and a Learning Partnership) looks like for each team.

This information will be followed by an after school opportunity to better understand English/Literacy programmes and Maths programmes. There is definitely plenty of information to come! Thank you for your patience!



SCHOOL TEAM - FLIPPA BALL

Taking expressions of interest in starting a Flippa Ball School Team played at the Millennium Pool on Sunday afternoons. Most of you already have your winter sports organised so depending on the amount of interest received we may need to look at starting in Term 1.

What is flippa Ball? Flippa Ball is most commonly known as 'Mini Water Polo'. The game is a water based sport and is a great way for kids to be active while building confidence when in the water. The game is for Primary aged school children from years 3, 4, 5 and 6. The sport is played in a shallow pool (1.2m – 1.3m deep) and uses a range of ball skills, swimming and team work. Flippa Ball is a great stepping stone into Water Polo with kids learning the basic skills needed to take on the deep water in Intermediate and Club level


