'Student-led Conferences': Wednesday 10 April



At the <u>end of 2023</u> we held 'student-led' conferences for the first time. The sharing of learning by each student supported the 'Progress Report' which had been issued by their teacher.

To end Term 1, we have **confirmed 'student-led' conferences** on **Wednesday 10 April - 2.30-3.30pm**. Apologies for the very late notice! This term has been dominated by BOT policy review and development of our strategic plans, aimed at enhancing teaching and learning and reporting progress and achievement processes. Lots of staff discussion, debate and clarifying - for long-term gain! For staff the refreshment of learning programmes and home learning has been a huge commitment. So we have only just confirmed readiness and organisation for this event. (See next two pages too!)

What do these 'student-led' conferences look like?

They won't be on the scale of the end of year ones (which were after a whole year of learning) but they will be a great **starting point** for the sharing of progress with learning this year.

What does sharing progress/achievement information look like across the rest of the year?

Our BOT will shortly be confirming our refreshed 'student progress and achievement' policies.

We will then **confirm our 'reporting student progress & achievement' timeline for the whole year**.

There will be a balance and a variety of approaches taken. Watch this space - coming very soon!



Student-Led Conferences - Why?

Long term goal ... we want ALL children to be able to openly, honestly and accurately share their learning strengths and areas for improvement/next steps. They can do this and we will help them! To achieve this they need adults to encourage them, support their reflection capabilities by asking them careful questions and share specific and constructive feedback to support their learning.

This conference is **designed to support children and parents** to have greater understanding of the child's learning progress - **to complement what teachers know about their learning capabilities**. We are not minimising the role the teacher plays in any way but it will provide further insight into how we can best support each child's success with learning.

How well do children understand the learning process and their capabilities?

Conferences outcomes may vary but we want every child to take positive (and realistic) steps when sharing, with the long term goal of having all children talk confidently about their learning, taking an active and meaningful role in their own success.

Each child will share a number of items from their learning in their classroom this term.

Teachers have direct input into what is most appropriate to share, but the learning will be shared by the children. We want to encourage them to have a voice and be confident to share it.
